II. Committee Background

The Ministry of Magic was founded in 1707 and is the London-based government headquarters for the British magical community. There are different Ministries of Magic around the world, one example being the French Ministry of Magic. The main goal of the Ministry of Magic is to keep Muggles from finding out about the existence of witches and wizards. Additional tasks include regulating magical travel, managing Muggle artifacts, organizing magical sports, and more.

The Ministry is headed by the most significant figure, the Minister of Magic. This position holds immense responsibility and power, including introducing legislation and chairing the Wizengamot, the wizarding equivalent of the high court of law. The Minister also maintains a relationship with the Muggle Prime Minister. In the Harry Potter timeline, the Minister of Magic is Cornelius Fudge, who is not believing the fact that Voldemort is back.

Access to the Ministry of Magic is granted via an old red telephone box by dialing 62442 (MAGIC on an alphabetical keypad). The Ministry is a sprawling, dark building with many floors and features a grand fountain adorned with golden statues and shimmering jets of water. Some notable departments include the Department of Magical Law Enforcement, the Department of Mysteries, and the Department of Magical Transportation.

III. History of Topic

Following the tragic incident at the last Triwizard Tournament, during which our beloved Cedric Diggory lost his life, a mysterious portal appeared in Diagon Alley. IV. Topic Information

Another topic to address. We have the mystery of who opened the portal. We have a lot of suspects, but they have not been discovered yet. The first, obvious suspect is Voldemort. The Dark Lord has lots of reasons to open the portal. Voldemort could have intentionally created or opened the portal to access powerful, extinct magical creatures that he can use to bolster his army. Also, teaming up with Grindelwald could help him complete his goal of ending the muggles.

As a second suspect, we have Grindelwald. Much like Voldemort, Grindelwald has a deeply entrenched belief in the superiority of pure-blood wizards and has previously sought out magical creatures to use in his plans. He may have opened the portal to access the powerful creatures and artifacts to further his mission of wizarding domination. He would be especially interested in any magical beings with the ability to control or destroy Muggles and Nomads, which is consistent with his ideology.

Together, they have devised a plan to train all young ex-alumni wizards (delegates of Brillamun). Dumbledore knows that to defeat Grindelwald and Voldemort, he must create a coalition of wizards and magical creatures who are willing to stand together rather than divide themselves. This new generation of wizards—along with magical beings from both worlds—must be prepared for the upcoming war, and Dumbledore is committed to ensuring that the light will not falter.

VI. Conclusion

As the Ministry of Magic confronts the growing consequences of the mysterious portal in Diagon Alley, the situation grows ever more dire. - 6. How can the magical community foster collaboration between wizards, witches, and magical creatures to counter the plans of Voldemort and Grindelwald?
